ACCOMMODATIONS

HOW

What Accommodations Do:

Change how a child is able to access content or curriculum, or how they demonstrate what they have learned.

MODIFICATIONS

WHAT

A change in what content or curriculum is being taught, or what a child is expected to learn.

What Modified cations Do:

Change the material, content or expectations of what is being taught to better meet the individual needs of a student.



ACCOMMODATIONS

MODIFICATIONS

HOW

Examples:

- -Extended time on an assessment
- -A graphic organizer provided for the algebra curriculum.
- -Preferential seating in class
- -Test read aloud
- -Simplified directions

WHAT <u>Examples:</u>

- -An alternative assessment
- -An alternative curriculum (numeracy versus algebra).
- -A different reading passage or book at a different reading level
- -Adjusted grading scale
